This is a notice of the extension of the consultation on main modification MM18, MM19 and MM148 to the Breckland Local Plan 2011 - 2026.

The Local Plan is the overarching planning document that will help guide sustainable development in Breckland over the plan period up to 2026. Once formally adopted, the Local Plan will guide development in Breckland, including policies to deliver the housing and employment needs. The Local Plan will replace most of the adopted local planning policy documents.

Breckland Council submitted the Local Plan to the Secretary of State in November 2017 under the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (regulation 22). Inspector Jonathan Manning was appointed to carry out an examination into the legal compliance and soundness of the Local Plan. Examination hearing sessions were held by the appointed Inspector between April - September 2018. Following the hearing sessions, the Inspector has proposed a number of modifications to the Local Plan which are considered necessary to ensure the soundness of the plan.

The Council invited representations on whether the Main Modifications were legally compliant and sound between Monday 18th February and 5pm 1st April 2019.

The Council is extending the main modifications consultation for a further six weeks, with regard to MM18, MM19 and MM148 only.

It has been noted that the track change version of the Local Plan (EX.125) and the consultation portal contained errors within the text, with regards to MM18, MM19 and MM148. The amended text did not accurately reflect the main modifications as listed in the main modifications schedule (EX.126).

As a result of this the Inspector has recommended the consultation on these modifications be extended to 5pm Wednesday 15th May 2019.

Only representations which relate to MM18, MM19 and MM148 will be accepted during the extension period.
