Decision (Action Agreed)	That the "neighbourhood area" proposed by Necton Parish Council on the attached map, is designated as the neighbourhood area.
Reasons(s)	This decision enables the progression of the Necton Neighbourhood Plan. In making this decision, it is confirmed that:

	That the 'relevant body', Necton Parish Council is the Parish Council for the area.  That the proposed area does not 'overlap' with another "neighbourhood area".  That it should not be designated as a 'business area' as the area does not just include business development.  That the "neighbourhood area", proposed by Necton Parish Council and shown on the attached map, is considered appropriate as the whole parish area is proposed to be
Options	designated as the neighbourhood area.  Where a relevant body (a parish council) has applied to the Council that a specified area should be designated as a "neighbourhood area", the Council has a duty to decide whether this is appropriate.  The only alternative option available would be to decide that the "neighbourhood area" is not appropriate.  There is no 'do nothing' option to consider as a determination is required by legislation.
